

### From the Pastor—

Create in me a clean heart O God
And renew a right spirit within me.
Cast me not away from your presence
And take not your holy spirit from me.
Restore unto me the joy of thy salvation
And uphold me with they free spirit.

These are the words of the Psalm with which we begin Lent on Ash Wednesday. The Psalm is clear to invite God to do the creating. God creates new and clean hearts in us this Lenten season.

The line of this Psalm that is striking to me is "Restore unto me the joy of they salvation." This is a worthy goal for Lent—that God might restore in us joy in God's salvation. In Bible Study this week we found this question, "What part of living in a relationship with God gives you the most joy?" What a great question that is! So often our relationships with God are marked more with duty and doing what we are supposed to do and following the directions rather than joy. It is a worthy goal for Lent that we might discover—for many of us again—the joy of being in relationship with God.

On Transfiguration Sunday the children marched out of church and then hid the Alleluia Banner. Children love to have a secret! On Easter Sunday morning they will march it back into the worship space. One of the secrets of children is that many of them know the joy of relationships that adults have forgotten. Expressing Easter joy is one of the goals of any Easter service.

The joy of being in relationship with God is truly a gift to us from the God who has chosen to love us. If it is possible that you are not living in that joy—experiencing it with all that you are, wondering where it went, I'd like you to join the search for retu4rning the Alleluia's to your life. Children are not the only ones who live in the alleluia space.

During Lent many opportunities exist for assisting in the search. See other parts of this newsletter for Lenten worship and gathering opportunities. Remember that God can be found in the sharing with our neighbors—food, stories of faith, prayer and song.

If joy in the salvation of God is lacking for you, join in Lenten opportunities or call me 315-724-5426 and

we can talk about what might work for you. This Lent is a good time for us to be restored to joy at the salvation of our God.

**Alcoholics Anonymous**® a fellowship of men and women who share their experience, strength and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem and help others to recover from alcoholism holds regular meetings in our facility.

**Seeds of Hope**, a local food pantry is a collaborative effort of First Presbyterian—Utica, Our Saviour, New Hartford Presbyterian, and New Hartford United Methodist churches.

### The ABC's of Flood Recovery

CRTC is focusing some of their efforts on Congregational Resourcing. One of the areas they have provided significant help with is disaster recovery efforts—they have created this helpful list.

### A is for Action

Each locality that is rebuilding can use help. Service teams can find ways to help daily. weekly or monthly:

- + Help prepare and/or serve meals:
- + Adopt a home—your church family can support a specific home & help fill their needs;
- + Mission teams are needed—stay local and make a difference:
- Spring cleanup—raking and yard work;
- + Donate items to local centers—winter clothing, guilts, even wedding & prom materials;
- + Skilled labor—accountants, electricians, plumbers, dry wall installers needed;
- + Kids can help too—plenty of work for hands of all ages!

### **B** is for BEING Proactive

What can YOU do to help? You'd be surprised. Simple jobs could be just the fit.

- Stories—personal tales of rescue, recovery and relationship—listen/document/share!
- Homecoming Cleaning—help in preparing homes for residency;
- + Deliveries—transport donations and deliver materials;
- Photography—get the message out via pictures;
- + Baskets—gifts baskets that say "Welcome Home!"
- + Office Help—several agencies are looking for part time office help—flexible hours.
