From the Pastor—

Remember when you were taught to share? It seems like one of the major messages from my childhood. I ought to share with my sister. It did not matter how much I wanted to have that....whatever. It mattered that we figure out a way to use it together. I think it is a good message. It is more than a good value to teach our children. It is a way of life. It is God's way for the sake of the world. It is God's intention that we share the amazing resources that we have so that all the world might have what it needs.

A good deal of my own personal theology about sharing – about what the world is intended to be comes from the first chapters of Genesis. This year during Lent, we will use some of the major stories from Genesis as the center of our meditations during Lenten Services. I love these stories! They are the basis of many other stories in the Bible and good place to start if you are interested in what the Bible is about.

You will be sharing my time for a bit. I have been asked by our Conference Dean to be the Transition Pastor at Zion, New Hartford. The pastor at Zion has resigned and they are without a pastor. They have people scheduled to fill in on Sunday mornings through March – but they need some time from me as well. I will be attending their Council Meetings and visiting their hospitalized folks and I will have office hours at Zion on Thursdays from 10 until Noon. You can still get ahold of me by calling the church office here, Linda will always know how to contact me.

We are also sharing our Ash Wednesday service with Zion. They will not have services there on Ash Wednesday, but instead have encouraged their folks to come here for worship.

The JAM time leaders met last month. It is their intention to encourage children to raise funds for Lutheran World Relief and especially issues around hunger. It is another way to share. It will be good for us to be generous with our contributions as well.

We have been asked and the Council has agreed – to share our space with another AA Group. They meet three days a week at noon. It does not interfere with the other groups that mostly meet at 6:30. Sharing our space so that others might come to know a Higher Power however they might understand is one of the ways we live God's intention for the world. Our relationships with the AA community are very positive. What happens in those meetings literally saves lives and changes the world. We get to participate in that saving and changing.

Flyers with information about Lenten worship are available. Share them! Let someone else know what is important to you during this Holy Season. Share with others what it is that gives you the courage to be a a sharing person in the world.

Our Community Outreach

Members of Our Saviour live among God's faithful people, serve all people, and strive for justice and peace in all the earth by sharing our building and supporting these programs:

Alcoholics Anonymous® a fellowship of men and women who share their experience, strength and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem and help others to recover from alcoholism holds regular meetings in our facility.

Seeds of Hope, a local food pantry is a collaborative effort of First Presbyterian—Utica, Our Saviour, New Hartford Presbyterian, and New Hartford United Methodist churches.

Hope House, a safe haven providing meals and other services in Utica is supported by volunteers from our congregation.

SPAN, a resource program for individual nurses who are affected by an alcohol or drug-related problem or related mental health problem meets weekly in our building.

HIV dinners which provide dinner and a place for people who are HIV positive to network and learn about the latest trends in treatment are held each month at our church.

Oneida County Lifeworks, peers helping peers build bridges to new lives, connecting people through enhancement of personal recovery, providing a safe, drug & alcohol free environment, providing local community resource guidance and enhancing life and social skills through peer to peer.

Message from the Council President

The Congregation Council meets the third Thursday of each month and all are welcome to attend. Our hope is for everyone to be involved in the ministry of Our Saviour. It has been mentioned many times at council meetings that we are a family. As such, we all have different roles and different responsibilities. We have different interests and abilities. But we all love each other, support each other and take care of each other.

The Congregation Council believes it is important to think about decisions in light of our beliefs as Christians. Our devotions are centered around the book "Reclaiming the 'L' word Renewing the Church from it's Lutheran Core" by Kelly Fryer. In this month's chapter, Kelly Fryer tells us of conversations with those in her congregation who worship there because of what Lutherans believe. Look for signs around church demon-

strating what it means to be a Christian who is also Lutheran. Also in this chapter we are reminded that some of the things people disagree over are things that just don't matter. We aim to be sure that people who worship with us understand the joy of grace. Also we don't want the things that don't really matter to come between us or between us and our God.

At this month's meeting, we voted to donate 10% of our investment income to Hope House. We discussed the need for an additional member on the audit committee. We authorized another Alcoholics Anonymous group to meet in our building. We have a committee of people looking into replacing our stoves using memorial gifts.


