From the Pastor...

Our Easter Gospel begins by telling us that the women came to the tomb on Easter morning with spices to anoint the dead Jesus' body. They may have heard from Jesus that he would be crucified and rise again on the third day - but it seemed to them that Jesus was dead. Their experience of dead was dead. If they were going to believe in Jesus rising from the grave, they needed evidence. The empty tomb was a sign. The men in dazzling clothes were another.

The first Sunday after Easter the Gospel lesson is always the same reading. Thomas is not with the others when Jesus appears to them. He refuses to believe. He needs to see evidence that Jesus is risen. Jesus shows Thomas his hands and feet. It is a sign - a big one.

We could be critical but the truth is that we are the same. We like evidence. Easter is passed. It is clearly the non-official beginning of Spring. We are eager to see the evidence. I can see the yellow part of my daffodil buds. It looks to me like my grass that was not really covered this winter is beginning to grow. We have slept a couple of nights with our window open just a crack. I have seen flocks of robins. I love this evidence! Something is happening!

I also see evidence of resurrection at Our Saviour. None of these are warm summer days - but they are signs that something new is happening.

- 1) Visitors have come to worship and some have even asked for a transfer.
- 2) First Communion Classes start soon. We are expecting nine children to participate.
- 3) Easter Fun Day! Children learning about resurrection, dyeing Easter eggs, frosting cupcakes, laughing, running, playing.
- 4) Holy Saturday people gathering. Getting communion ready, moving chairs around, arranging flowers, changing lightbulbs, fixing kneelers.
- 5) 50/50 conversations that are lively and are marked by new ideas and people actually willing to do the ideas.
- 6) A church full of people on Easter morning singing, praying enjoying one another.
- 7) Lenten Worship that was well-attended and appreciated by those who were there again laughter, again prayer, again the joy of being together.
- 8) Ten people went to support two of our teens in their school play.
- 9) When I say to new AA leaders that we really support what they are doing, they tell me that everyone already knows that.
- 10) Bible Study will begin again this month.

None of these are resurrection, but they are evidence that resurrection is among us. Jesus rose from the dead. It was difficult for those around Jesus to believe. They needed to all kinds of signs before it seemed real to them. We have chosen to believe this amazing story. It is time for us to begin looking around us for signs that God can and will raise us up to new life. It is life that is meant for those who have not seen it yet. It is life that is meant to be hope for the hopeless. It is life that exists so that others might live.

Our Community Outreach

Members of Our Saviour live among God's faithful people, serve all people, and strive for justice and peace in all the earth by sharing our building and supporting these programs:

Alcoholics Anonymous® a fellowship of men and women who share their experience, strength and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem and help others to recover from alcoholism holds regular meetings in our facility.

Seeds of Hope, a local food pantry is a collaborative effort of First Presbyterian—Utica, Our Saviour, New Hartford Presbyterian, and New Hartford United Methodist churches.

Hope House, a safe haven providing meals and other services in Utica is supported by volunteers from our congregation.

SPAN, a resource program for individual nurses who are affected by an alcohol or drug-related problem or related mental health problem meets weekly in our building.

HIV dinners which provide dinner and a place for people who are HIV positive to network and learn about the latest trends in treatment are held each month at our church.

Oneida County Lifeworks, peers helping peers build bridges to new lives, connecting people through enhancement of personal recovery, providing a safe, drug & alcohol free environment, providing local community resource guidance and enhancing life and social skills through peer to peer generated programs and support. Program offices are located at Our Saviour on the 2nd floor.

Fearless Generosity: of Stewardship and Stuff

"...So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God."

Luke 12:21

Our relationship with money and "stuff" is deeply spiritual. The root of the word miserable is "miser"- one who is unable to give.

The rich man in Jesus' parable of the "rich fool" (Luke 12: 13-21) speaks only to himself. He has no one with whom to share his own thoughts, not even God, showing a real poverty of relationships. His solution to having "too much stuff" was to tear down his barns to build bigger ones, forgetting that all things, including his own life, belong to God. The parable could've ended differently had he prayed: "Hey God, I have a bumper crop this year; do you have any hungry folks around who need some food?"

It is often difficult for us to talk about our anxious and often addictive relationship with money and "stuff." All that we have is God's and as stewards of God's possessions we are called to live out, "embody" fearless generosity. Stewardship is NOT fundraising, but calls us to examine the deeply spiritual aspect of our living and giving, our relationship with God, with one another, with God's mission in the world and, yes, with God's stuff!

We give thanks for generous givers who embody fearless generosity with faith grounded in Christ, pure gift of our extravagantly generous God. (Read the full article in this month's <u>Lutheran Magazine Synod Insert</u> – page "B".)

Seeds of Hope

Seeds of Hope is operated by four Ministry Partners: First Presbyterian, Utica, New Hartford Presbyterian. Our Saviour Lutheran Church and New Hartford United Methodist.

The Mission Statement of the Pantry is: "Seeking to reflect God's Love, we are an interactive community providing Supplemental nutritional needs, offering hospitality, education and advocacy for our neighbors."

Volunteers are always needed to keep the pantry operating. There are many ways to help. Some volunteers do pick ups at Price Chopper, Panera Bread or The Outback Steakhouse. The Pantry receives "day old" or "that day" food that is frozen in portions. Volunteers help guide clients through the pantry and do the intake paper work. The volunteers are involved with the Steering Committee that meets every four to six weeks.

The Pantry is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9:30 am to 11:30 am. Clients must bring proof of receiving assistance and current mail to show evidence of where they live. They are provided with three days of food according to the size of their family. Clients can receive assistance once a month.

Seeds of Hope has been in operation since 2009. When Our Saviour became part of this Ministry is was with the understanding that our church would commit to an annual benevolence of \$3000 to their budget. Over the last couple of years we have had to withdraw money from our endowments to meet our financial obligations. I would like you to consider a monthly donation to help meet our yearly commitment to Seeds of Hope.

Seeds of Hope is another way that you can support a program that helps people in and around our church. That help can be as a volunteer at the Pantry or by making a financial donation. Help reach out to those who need a helping hand.


