From the Pastor...

Our Saviour Lutheran Church Newsletter

In the fall of 1835 announcements went out about a meeting of abolitionists at Second Presbyterian Church on Bleecker St. In Utica, New York. 600 people attended that meeting on October 21, 1835. It was disrupted by a group of people who believed the abolitionists were fanatics. The abolitionists were invited to reconvene in Peterboro, NY.

A few weeks ago, Mark and I visited the Abolitionist Hall of Fame in the building where they met in Peterboro. I was really inspired by these abolitionists. It takes a special kind of person to look around them at what much of the world thinks is ordinary and natural and the way it has always been and say to themselves that it is time for change and they will participate in the change.

I want to invite you to a little trip with me to Peterboro. David Cleaver-Bartholemew, the new pastor at Zion, and I are thinking this is a great mixer for our two congregations. Mark and I also discovered that what seems to be the only store in Peterboro also has homemade pie and ice cream. Really how can you resist an invitation like this one!

Beyond it being a fun trip, I am thinking that it has the possibility of reminding us of what really big ideas - what signs that the Kingdom of God is here among us - can come from Utica - from us who believe that God goes with us. We know that slavery did not end because of one meeting. We know that it took a great deal of work and courage.

As the Gospel of Luke walks us through the life of Jesus in our Gospel readings this summer, it will be a good time for us to be inspired to by ones who also looked around their world and wondered how they might participate in Kingdom of God.

It is so easy for us to look around ourselves and see the incredible violence that seems to erupt in every corner of the world - at the violence that is done to children as Diane Klafehn encouraged us to see - at the disease that brings down so many lives. It is so easy for us to shake our heads and say that we are powerless to make a change. Well, those folks meeting at Second Presbyterian did not do that. They decided to take it upon themselves to change the world. This is the summer for hearing the stories of Jesus and wondering what part of Jesus' ministry belongs to us. This is the summer for us to commit ourselves to the ways of God in the world anew.

In your service folder each Sunday is a list of what Luke tells us Jesus' ministry was all about. I would be only too happy to hear from you as you consider those ministries. I would be only too happy to hear how you have been inspired to change the world like those 600 abolitionists. God continues to work in us. As Martin Luther says "the Kingdom of God comes indeed without our prayer but..." The Kingdom of God comes and you and I get to participate.

Over the course of the assembly, voting members:

hear reports and review the work of churchwide organization officers, leaders and units;
receive and consider proposals from synod assemblies;
elect a new ELCA vice president, board members and other leaders as specified by the constitution or bylaws;
establish ELCA policy;
worship together;
adopt a budget; and
conduct other business related to the ELCA churchwide organization.


